Sirius College is proud of its reputation as having the highest university offers in the North Western suburbs, remarkably, since its first graduates.

In January 2013, the school name was changed from 'ISIK College' to 'Sirius College' to better reflect the diverse communities it represents. Sirius is the brightest star in the night sky.

Sirius College is not only an academic school but dedicated to raising individuals with multiple skills in different areas such as sport, music and performing arts.

Today, Sirius College plays a leading role in educating young generations with its academic excellence and disciplined education; and continues to contribute to the future of Australia.

UR HISTORY

he previous Governing Authority of Sirius College, the Selimiye Foundation Pty Ltd. was established in 1995, and acquired Eastmeadows Primary School, and established an Independent School named ISIK College.

Eastmeadows Campus commenced its operation in 1997 and offers a Prep to Year 12 education program. Eastmeadows Campus is currently sectioned as Primary (Co-ed) and Secondary (Girls only).

Meadow Fair Campus commenced its operation in 2005 as Upfield Campus and was relocated to its current site in mid 2010. It offers a year 7- Year 12 educational program. (Boys Only).

Keysborough Campus commenced its operation in 2001 and offers a co-educational program for years Foundation-Year 12.

Shepparton Campus commenced its operation in 2005 and offers a co-educational program for years Foundation-Grade 6.

Ibrahim Dellal Campus in Sunshine commenced its operation in 2010 and offers a co-educational program for years Foundation-Year 10.

Dallas Campus commenced its operation in 2015 and accommodates Grade 5's and Grade 6's only.

The number of enrolments at SIRIUS College has increased from 28 students in 1997 to more than 2600 students across all campuses in 2018.

The Governing Authority of Sirius College has been changed to Sirius College Ltd. in 2016.

VALUE ADDED

STEM

TEM has been formally introduced to all primary campuses of Sirius College in 2020, beginning at year 1 through to year 4. In 2021 the year 5 have taken on STEM, with intentions of extending it into year 6 in 2022. The STEM program consists of a variety of units which cover the areas of science, technology, engineering, and maths. The units that are on offer throughout the primary years consist of: Lego Masters and Lego Technics, animation, computing (Pipers), construction, introduction to electricity, robotics (Ozobots), scientific projects, community initiatives (improving our school) and coming in 2022 mathematical problem solving and open ended maths. STEM is a non-assessed subject, allowing the teachers to go with the pace and the interests of their students while discovering each unit. Throughout the units students are involved in the STEM process of thinking about the challenge/problem at hand, planning/solving, designing, reviewing/ testing and evaluating.



myEdOnline

ith the introduction of remote learning during COVID-19, Sirius College has implemented the use of myEdOnline. Teachers were able to transform content into an engaging learning experience, track student progress and give feedback all in one place. It is a collaborative teaching and learning platform which made remote or distance learning easy.

We have continued the use of myEdOnline in Integrated Studies even after the conclusion of remote learning with the added benefits to both students and teachers. The benefits for teachers are no test papers to take home and print, self-correcting options and reduced calculation. Benefits to students are that they are practicing skills required for other official online assessments such as NAPLAN, they are continuing to develop their computer skills and they are familiar with the way virtual tasks work.

The introduction of myEdOnline also allows teachers to assign weekly homework tasks with 0% paper wastage.

OUTCOME-BASED ACADEMIC REPORTS

rimary academic reports have been changed from term 2 onwards in 2019. They are now outcomes based for each subject area with a focus on Achievement Standards from the Australian National Curriculum. Reports are sent electronically to parents as of 2020 which means 0% paper and printing wastage.

OXFORD OWL

xford Owl is an award-winning website from Oxford University Press. It is created for the purpose of supporting children's learning both at home and at school. Oxford Owl for school is an excellent resource for online teaching, learning materials, assessment resources and expert support.

OXFORD MATHS

xford Maths is an award-winning student maths resource that has been implemented at Sirius College 2020. It provides excellent support for all teachers, regardless of maths confidence and experience and it aligns with the National Curriculum.

Oxford Maths focuses on differentiation informed by pre- and post-assessments. It enables all teachers to support students at their point of need for each topic. It supports inquirybased learning due to its explicit instruction and hands-on approach, (whole class and small group activities).

READ WRITE INC.

he Read Write Inc. Phonics Program has been introduced to F-2 students with implementation in Foundation 2020 for across all campuses.

Developed by Ruth Miskin, Read Write Inc. provides a structured and systematic approach to teaching literacy. All of the teaching is underpinned by phonics. It is a program that is proven to create fluent, enthusiastic readers, confident speakers and willing writers. It also incorporates effective classroom management strategies that ensure participation and fast progress for all students.

THE AUSTRALIAN ARMY CADETS

he Australian Army Cadets (AAC) is a personal development program for young people that is conducted by the Australian Army in cooperation with Sirius College. However cadets are not members of the Army.

The first AAC School unit in which most students are Muslim, started online training due to Covid restrictions in 2020 after months of careful preparation.

Commencement of the unit created a huge interest within the AAC Community and was acknowledged by the Governor-General of Australia praising Sirius College at his speech.

The program involves:

- Weekly parades include field training and regular physical activities like:
 - Army marching
 - Teamwork & leadership skills
 - Navigation & Army map reading
 - Outdoor Survival skills
 - Self-discipline
- Regular Camps at various army barracks & wilderness locations.







STUDENT SATISFACTION:






ATAR Scores



MEADOW FAIR CAMPUS TERTIARY ENROLMENT DISTRIBUTION








