Since its first operation, Sirius College has grown beyond expectations to meet the tremendous demand of the community and has managed to reach about 3300 student enrolments across 6 campuses in 2023. This was made possible by the support of the community and their abiding concern and generosity.

Sirius College is proud of its reputation as having the highest university offers in the North Western suburbs, remarkably, since its first graduates.

In January 2013, the school name was changed from 'ISIK College' to 'Sirius College' to better reflect the diverse communities it represents. Sirius is the brightest star in the night sky.

Sirius College is not only an academic school but dedicated to raising individuals with multiple skills in different areas such as sport, music and performing arts.

Today, Sirius College plays a leading role in educating young generations with its academic excellence and disciplined education; and continues to contribute to the future of Australia.

OUR HISTORY

The previous Governing Authority of Sirius College, the Selimiye Foundation Pty Ltd. was established in 1995, and acquired Eastmeadows Primary School, and established an Independent School named ISIK College.

Eastmeadows Campus commenced its operation in 1997 and offers a Prep to Year 12 education program. Eastmeadows Campus is currently sectioned as Primary (Co-ed) and Secondary (Girls only).

Meadow Fair Campus commenced its operation in 2005 as Upfield Campus and was relocated to its current site in mid 2010. It offers a year 7- Year 12 educational program. (Boys Only).

Keysborough Campus commenced its operation in 2001 and offers a co-educational program for years Foundation-Year 12.

Shepparton Campus commenced its operation in 2005 and offers a co-educational program for years Foundation-Grade 6.

Ibrahim Dellal Campus in Sunshine commenced its operation in 2010 and offers a co-educational program for years Foundation-Year 12.

Dallas Campus commenced its operation in 2015 and accommodates Foundation to Grade 6 students.

The number of enrolments at SIRIUS College has increased from 28 students in 1997 to about 3300 students across all campuses in 2025.

The Governing Authority of Sirius College has been changed to Sirius College Ltd. in 2016.

VALUE ADDED

YEAR 12 AIESEC PROGRAM

Sirius College introduced the Year 12 Career Development and Leadership Program in partnership with AIESEC, a global youth-led organisation affiliated with leading Australian universities. The initiative brought together Year 12 students from across all secondary campuses for a unique intercampus experience designed to support a positive and engaging transition into their final year of schooling.

Through interactive workshops, career exploration sessions, leadership development activities, and opportunities for peer connection, students gained valuable insights into future study and career pathways while building meaningful relationships with their peers.

The program provided an innovative and collaborative start to the academic year, promoting student wellbeing, strengthening engagement, and enhancing preparedness for the challenges and opportunities of Year 12. By fostering leadership skills, self-awareness, and future-focused thinking, the AIESEC partnership contributed significantly to students' personal growth and readiness for life beyond school.



STUDENT SUMMIT

The Student Representative Council (SRC) launched the Student Summit, an innovative student voice initiative designed to strengthen collaboration between students and school leadership. The summit provided students with a structured platform to identify opportunities for school improvement, develop practical solutions, and present their ideas directly to the College Management Team. Following the presentations, school leaders reviewed each proposal and provided feedback on potential actions and future considerations.

The initiative empowered students to play an active role in shaping their school community while developing valuable leadership, communication, problem-solving, and advocacy skills. By encouraging meaningful dialogue and collaboration, the Student Summit fostered a culture of shared responsibility and continuous improvement.

The Student Summit reinforced the College's commitment to authentic student participation and ensured that student perspectives remained central to decision making and ongoing school improvement efforts.

STUDENT EXPO

The College's annual VCE Subject Expo provided Years 9–11 students with the opportunity to explore future study pathways and make informed subject selections.

VCE teachers and current students showcased a wide range of subjects, providing insights into course content, assessment requirements, learning experiences, and potential career pathways. Through displays, student work samples, and discussions, students gained a clearer understanding of subject expectations and opportunities.

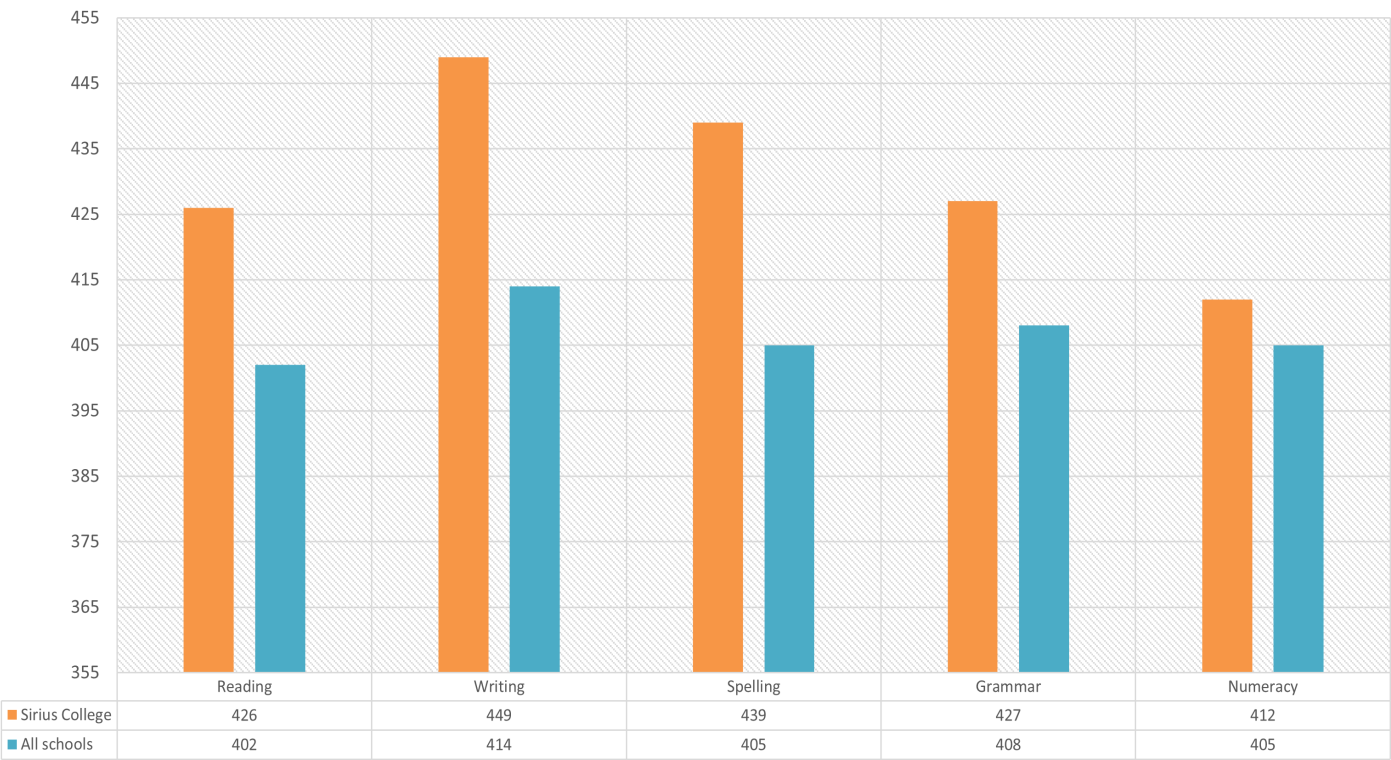

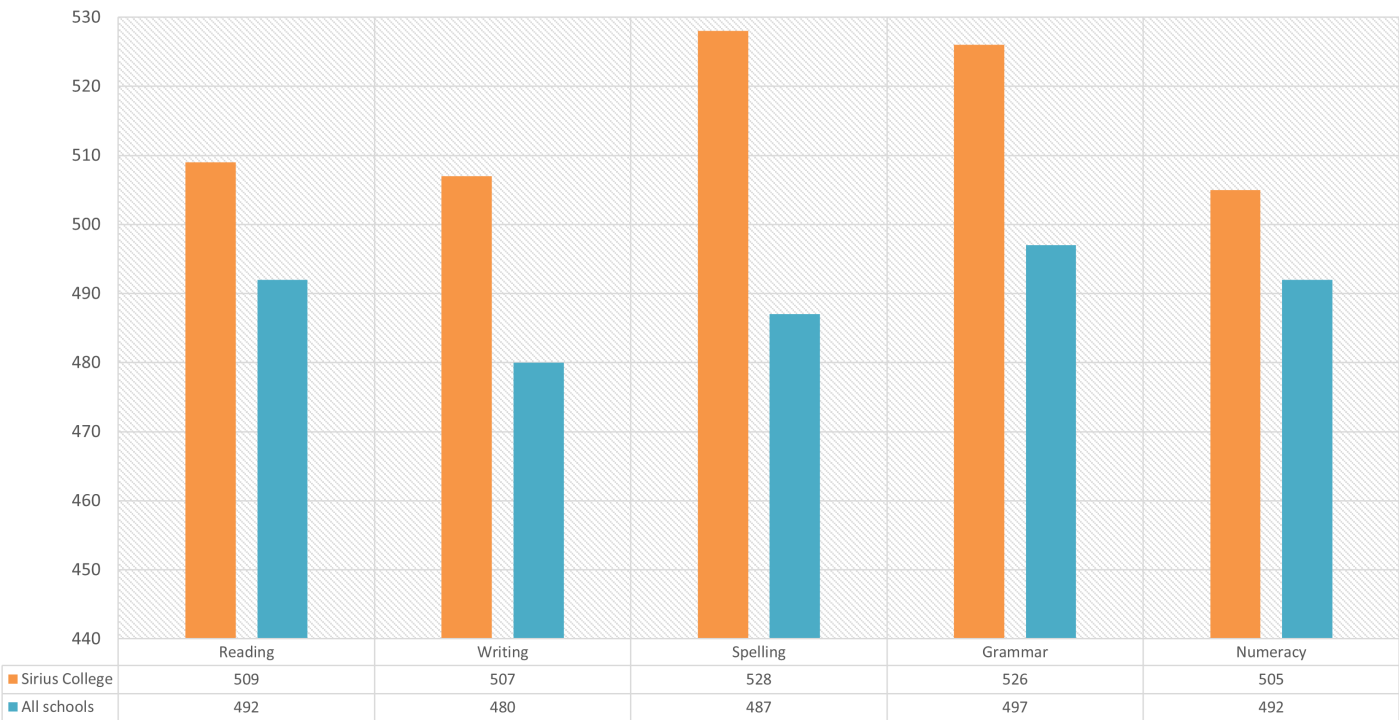
Sirius College average in all areas are well above the national average in this year level.

2025 NAPLAN SCORES - GRADE 3



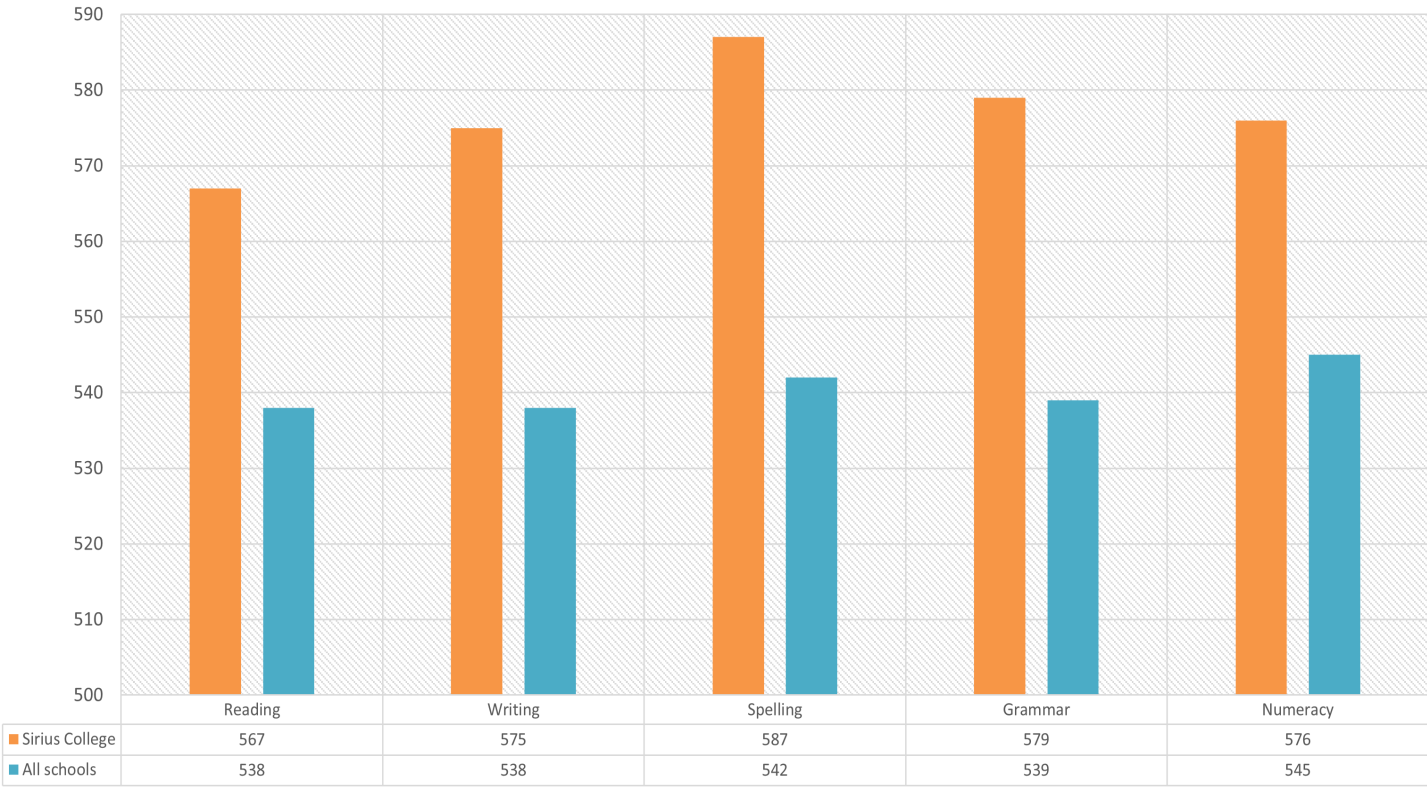
Sirius College average in all areas are well above the national average in this year level.

2025 NAPLAN SCORES - GRADE 5



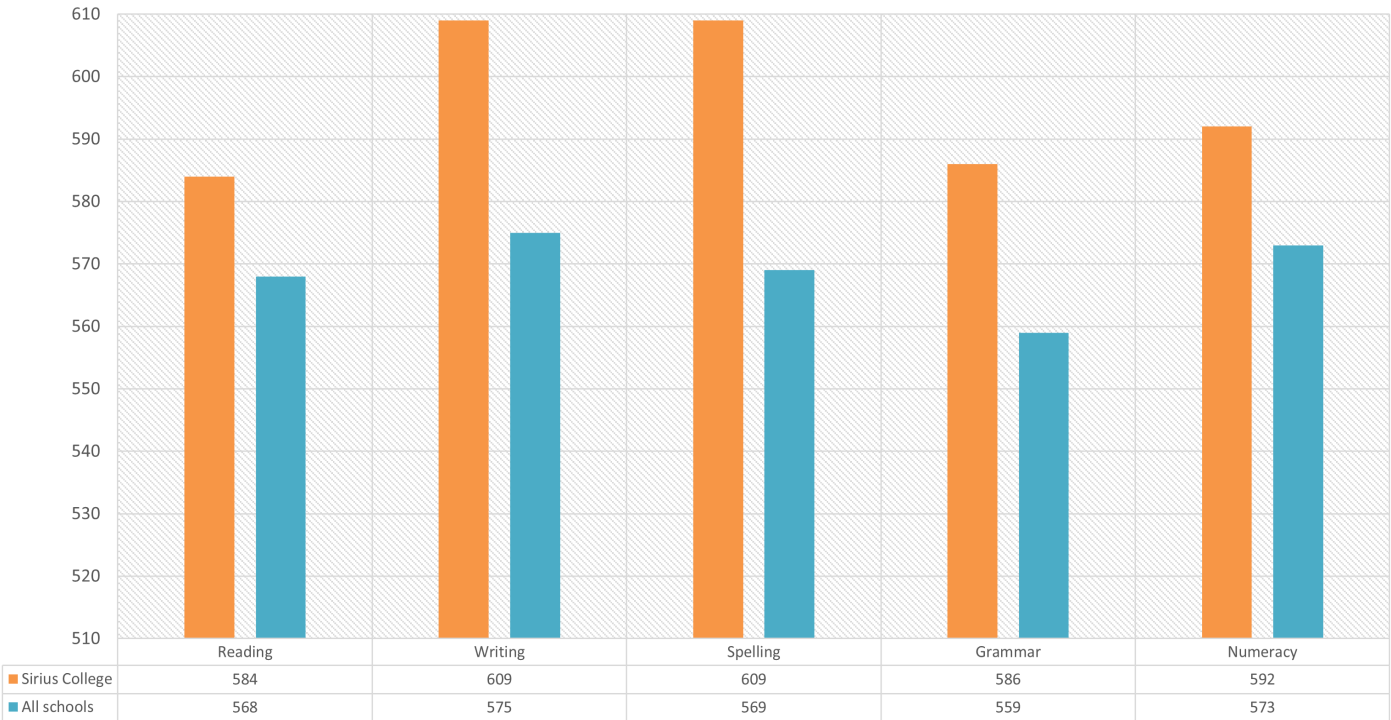

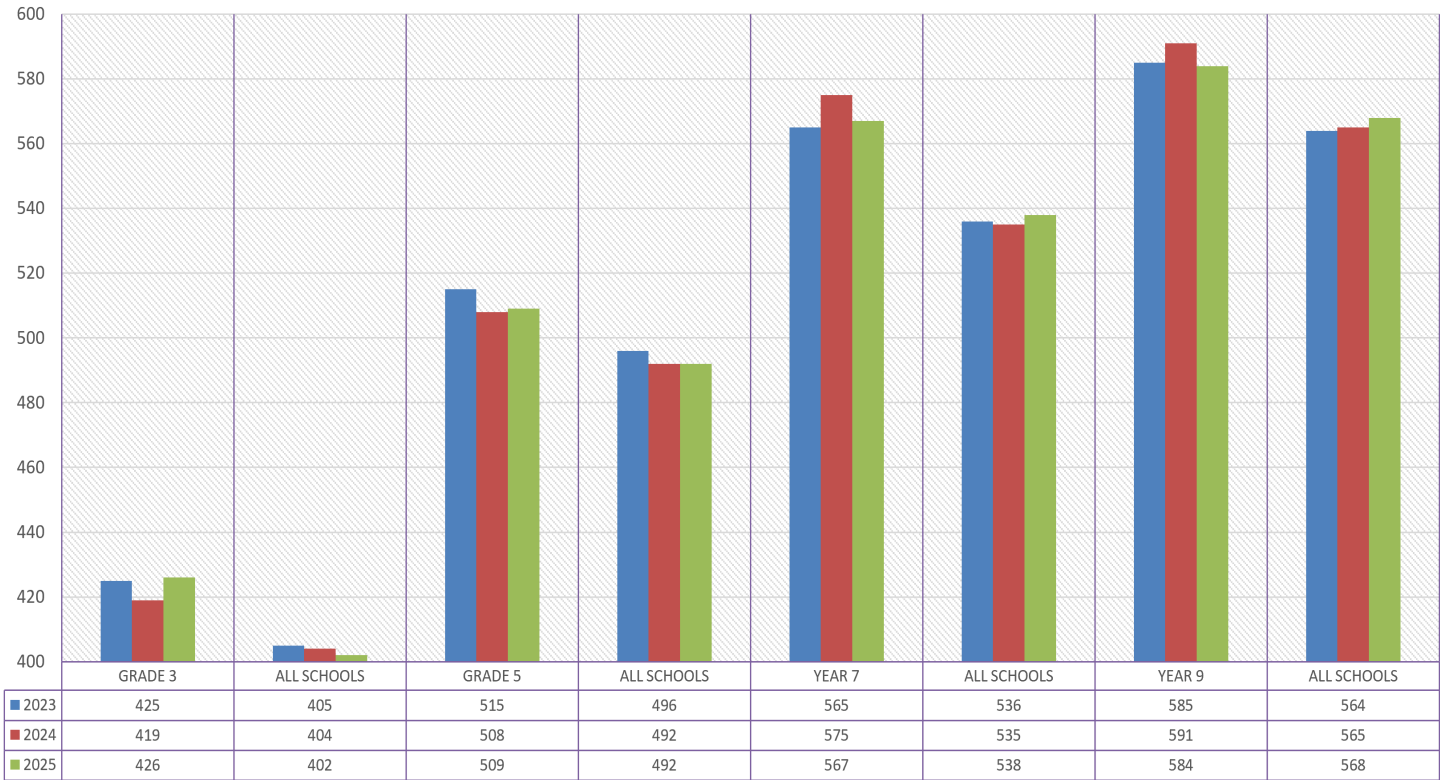

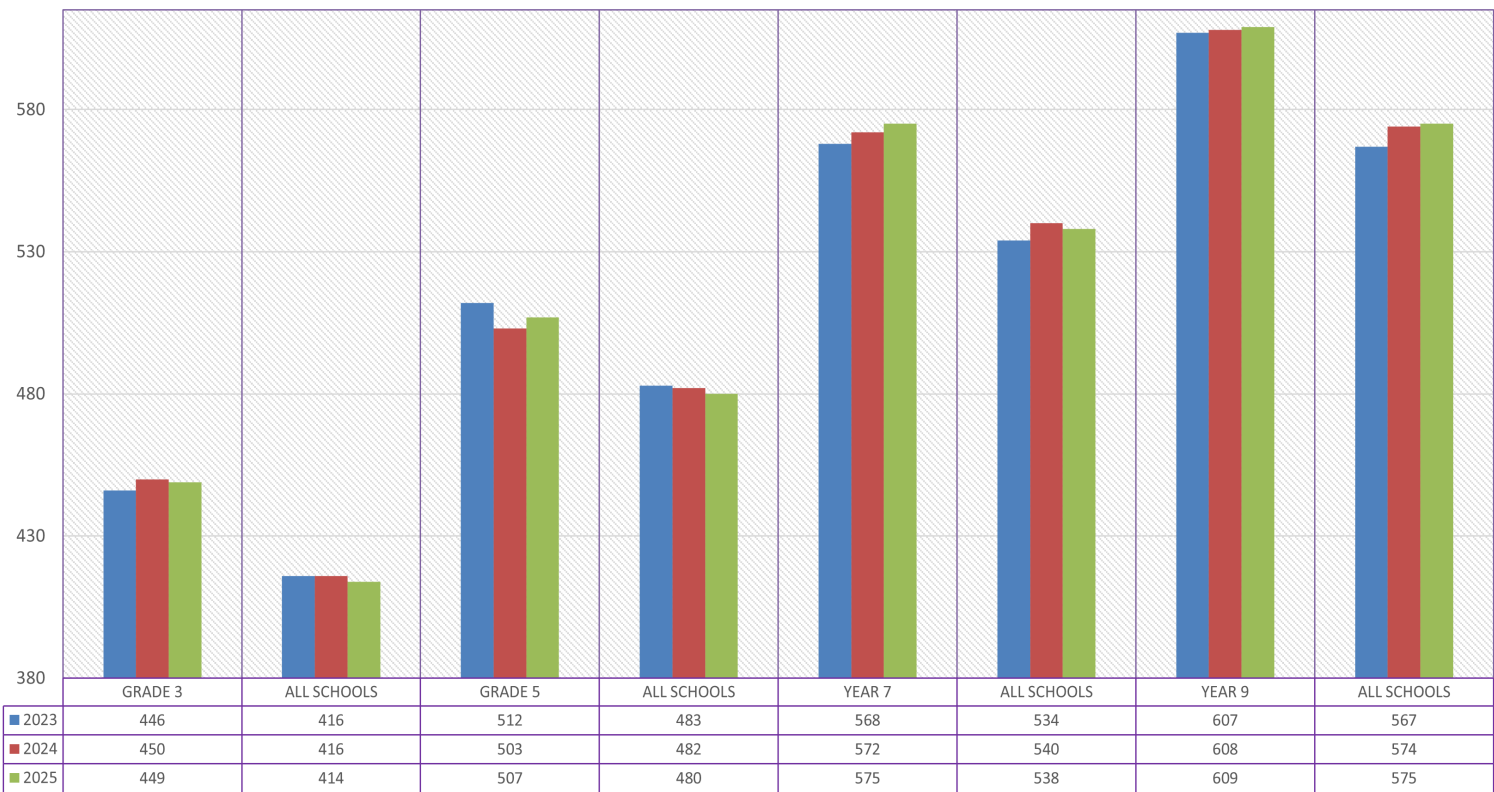

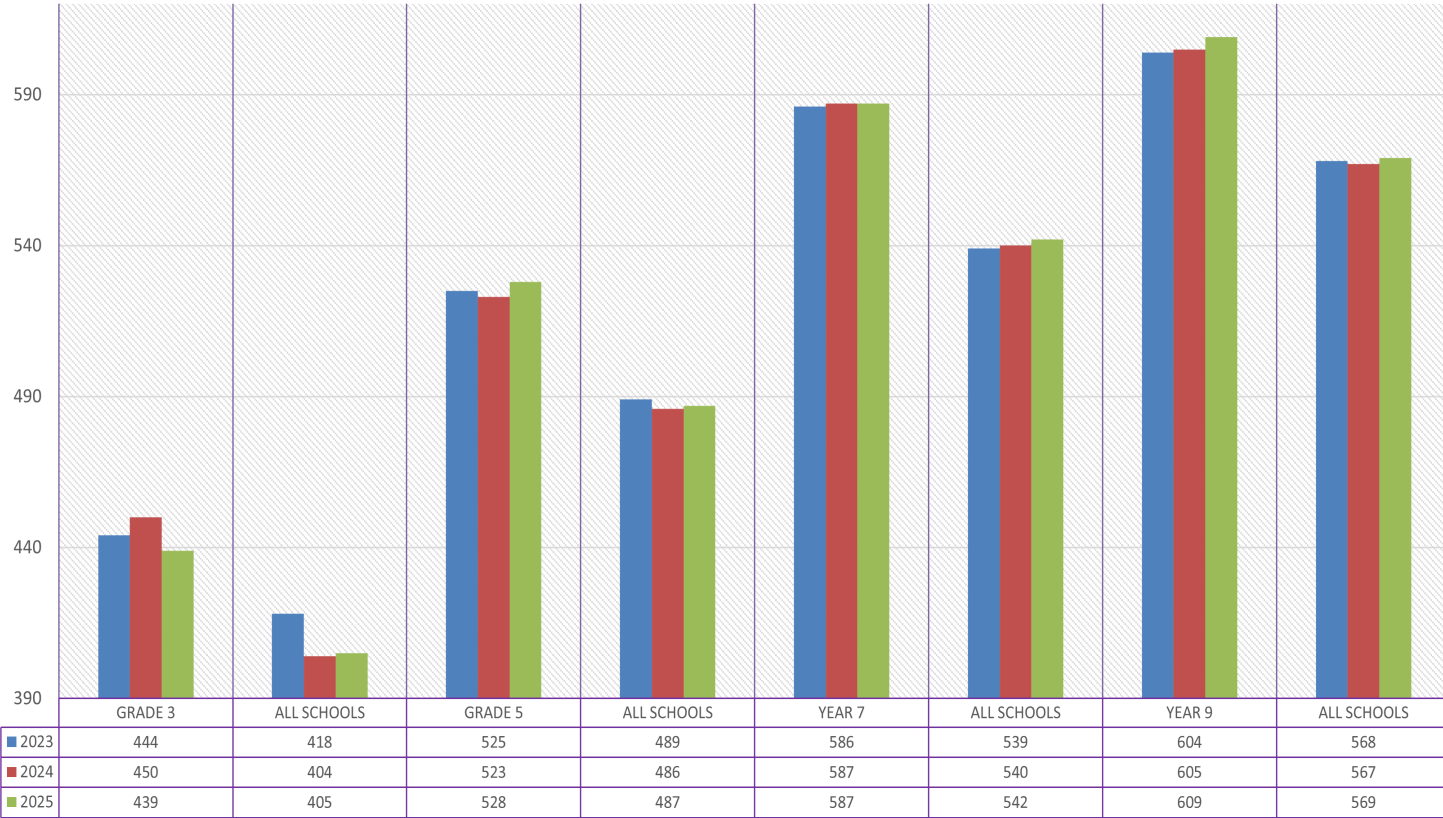

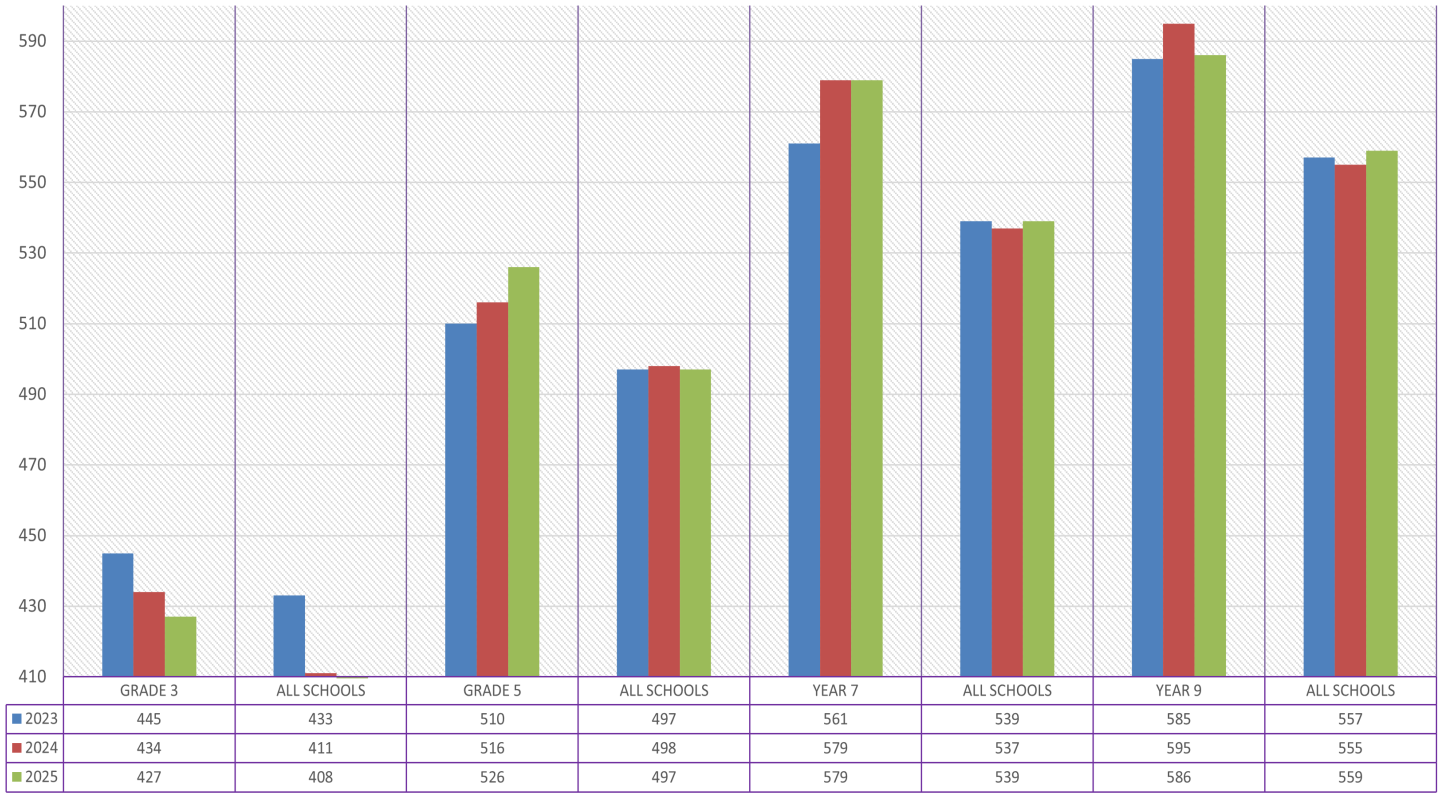

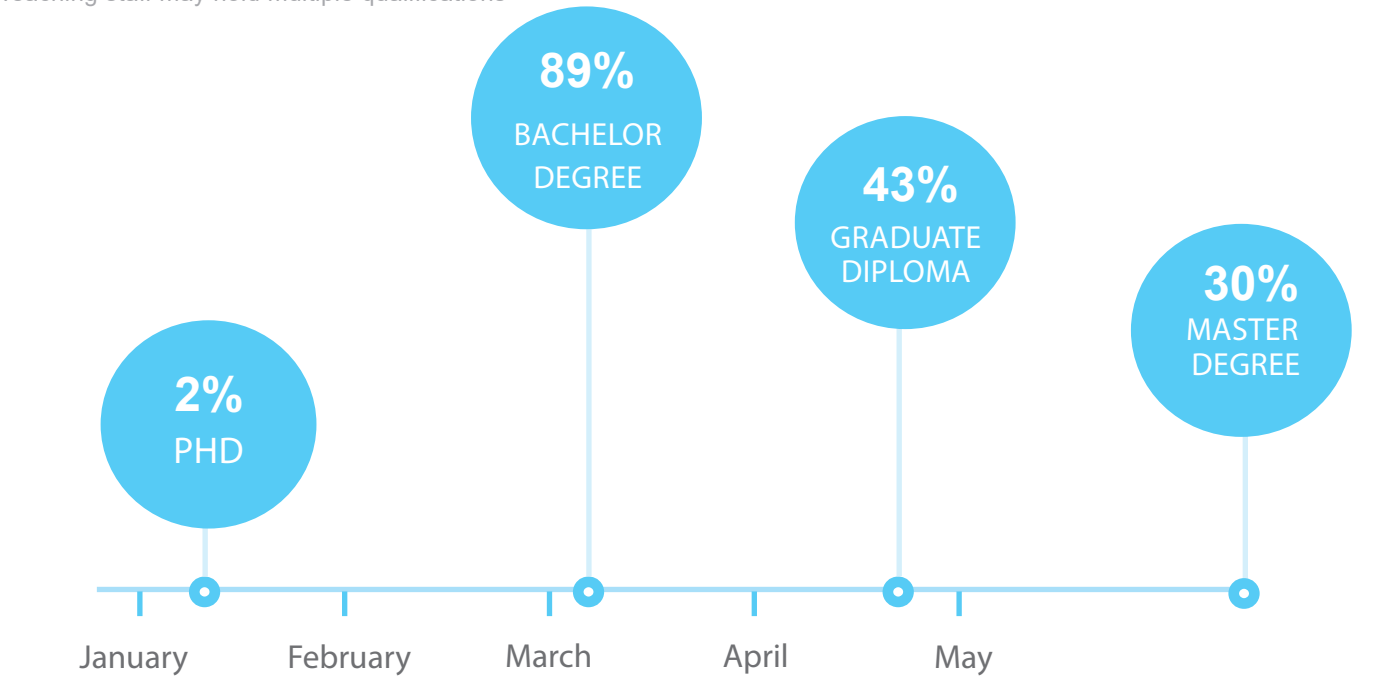

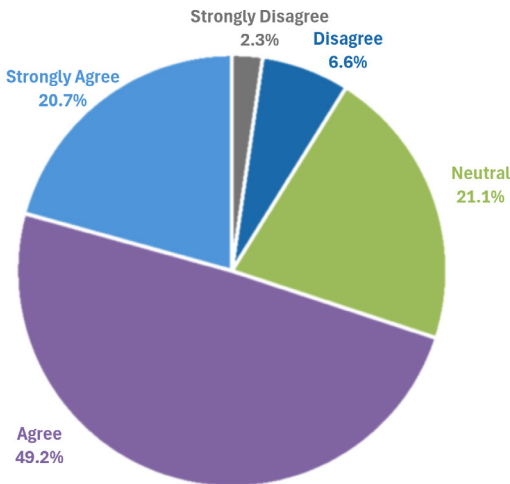

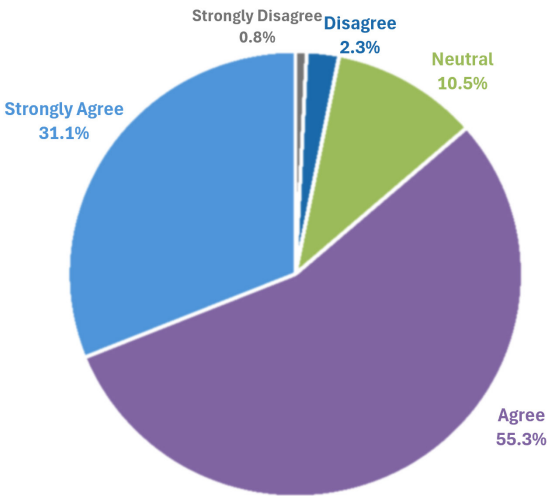

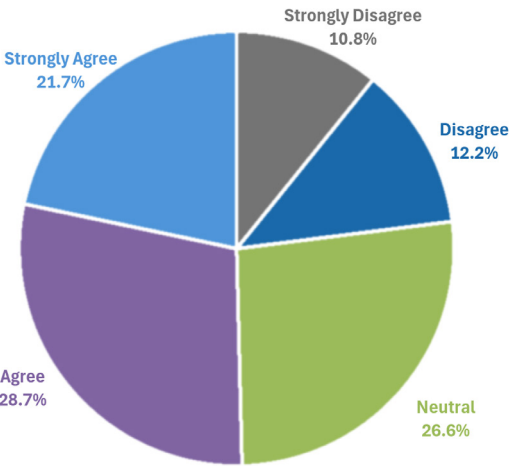

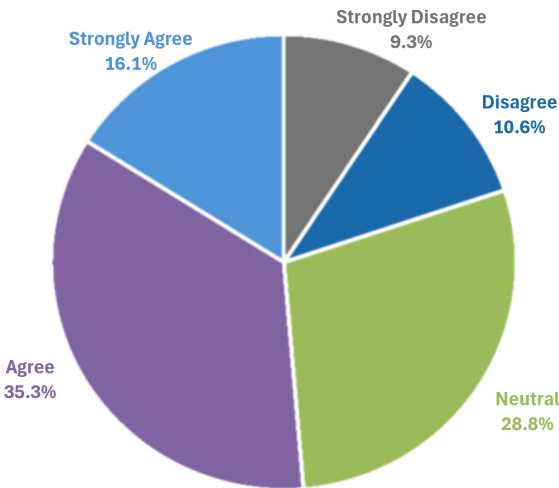

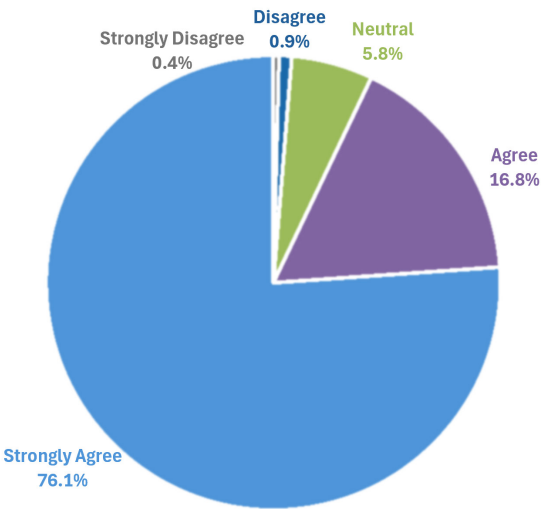

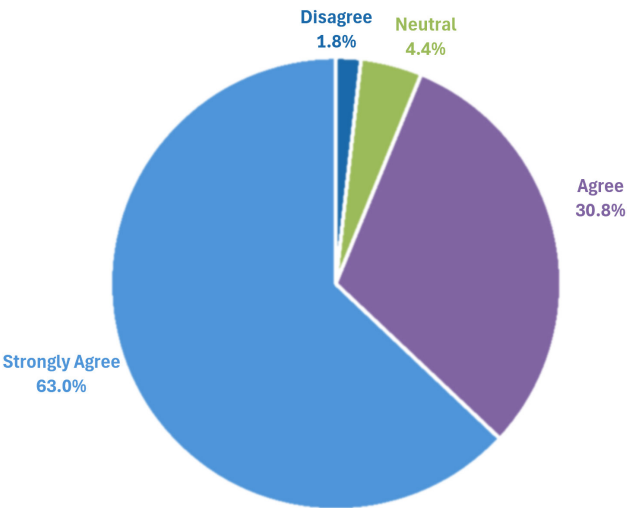

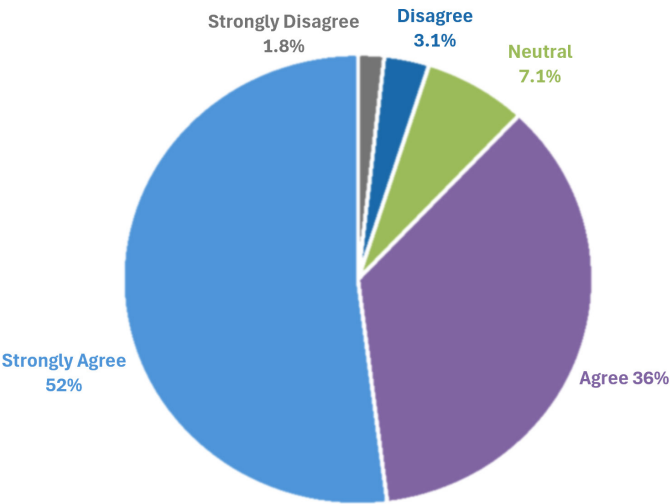
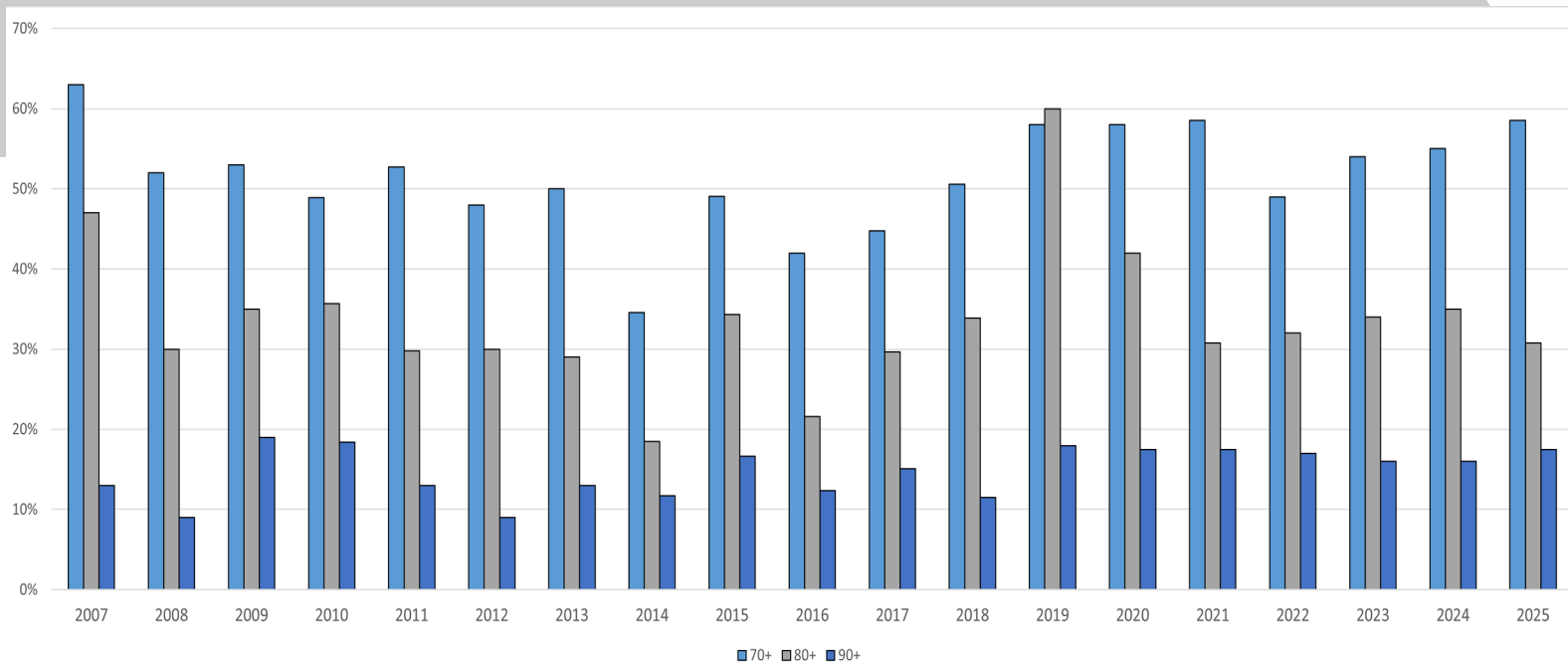

ATAR Scores

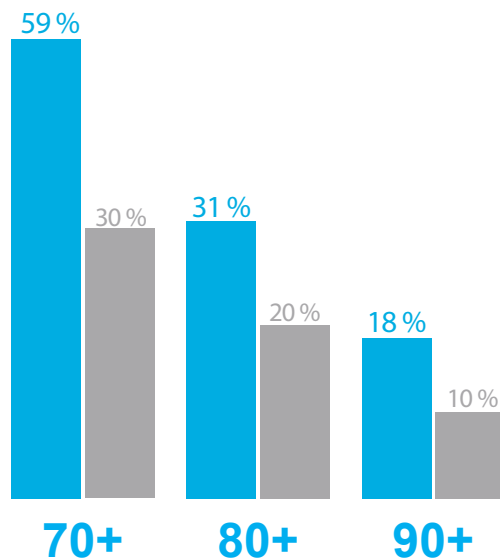
Comparing Sirius College graduates' ATAR scores to State

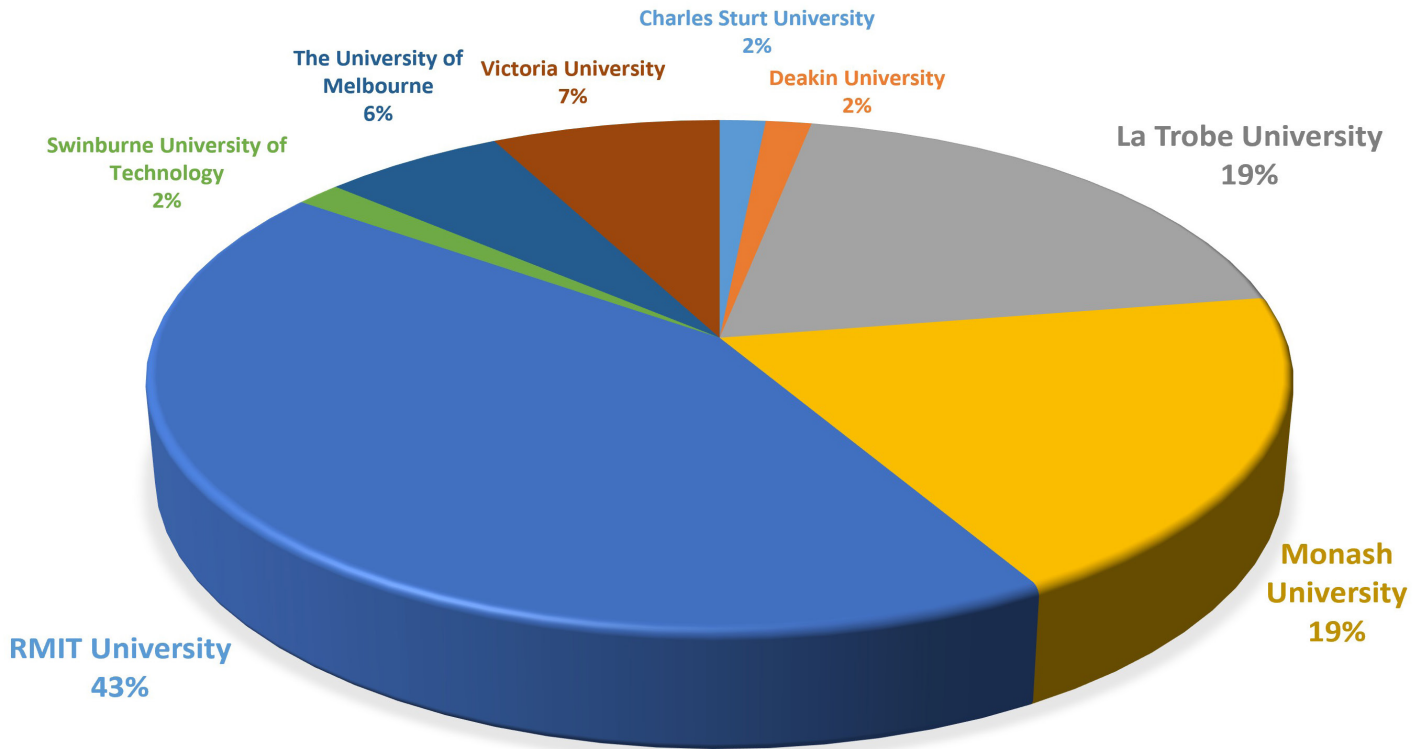

MEADOW FAIR CAMPUS TERTIARY ENROLMENT DISTRIBUTION

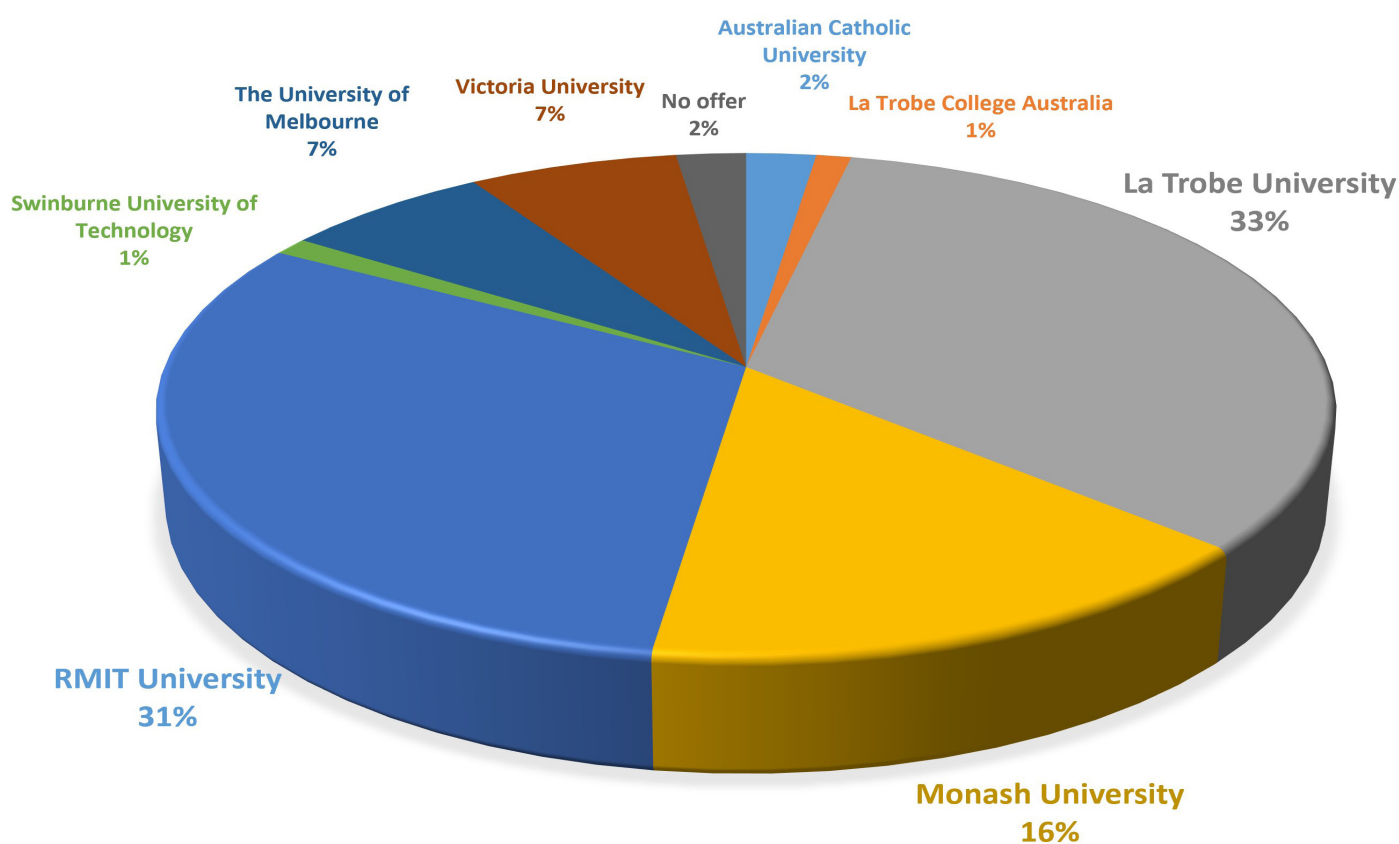

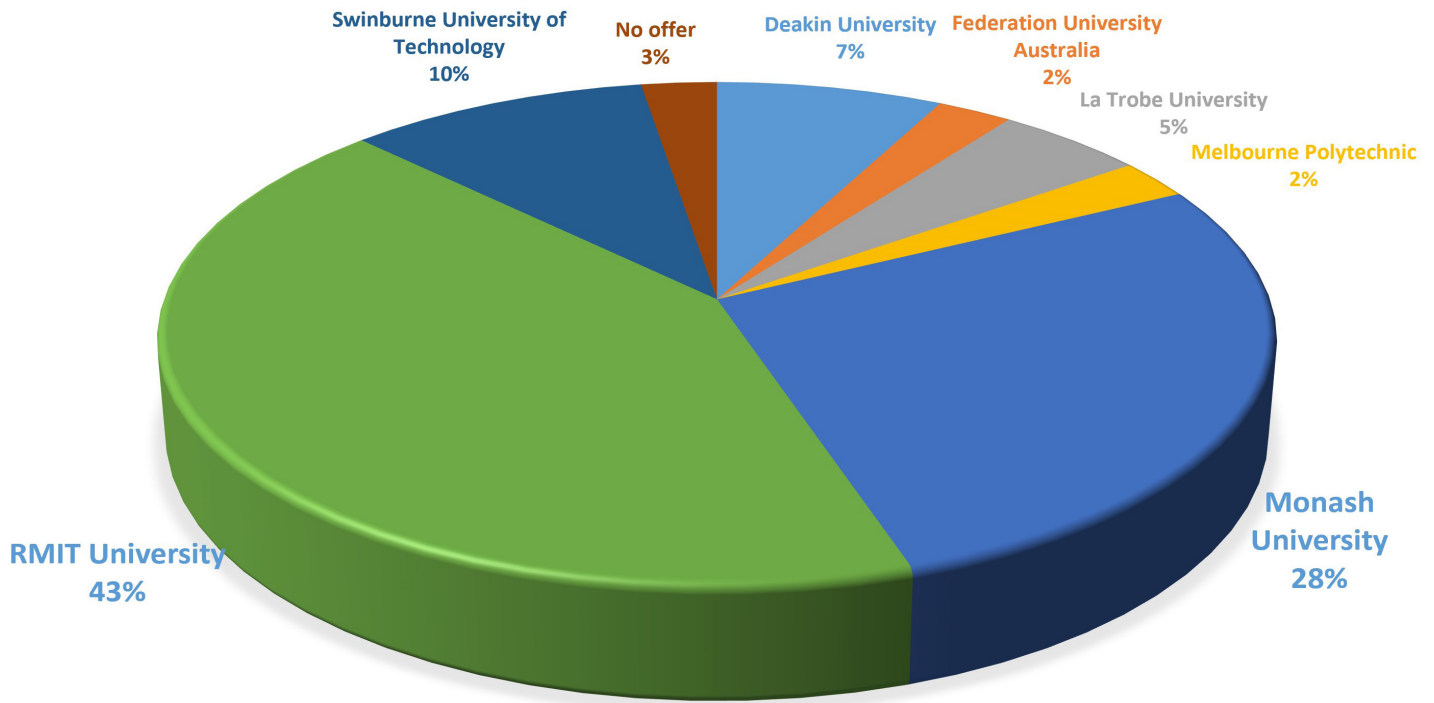

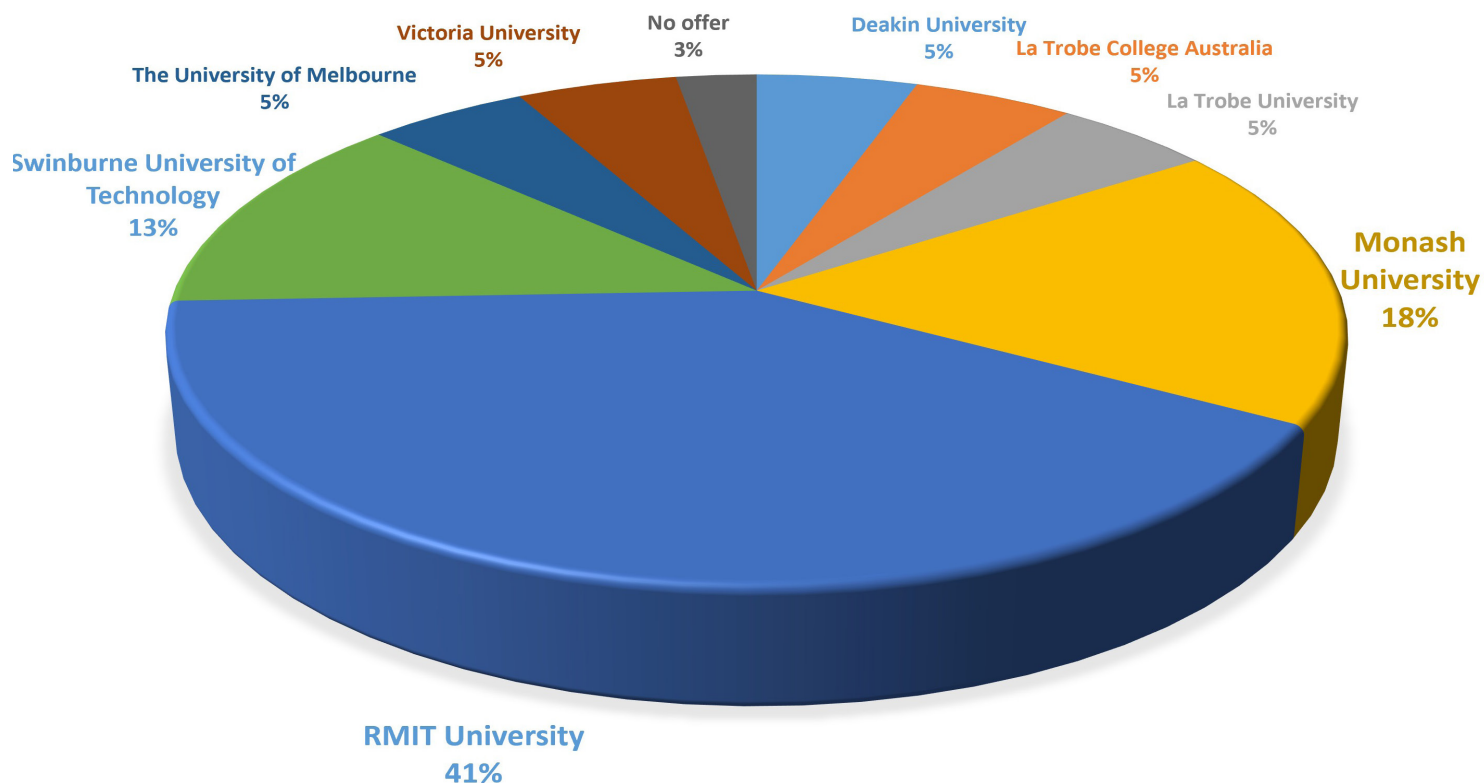

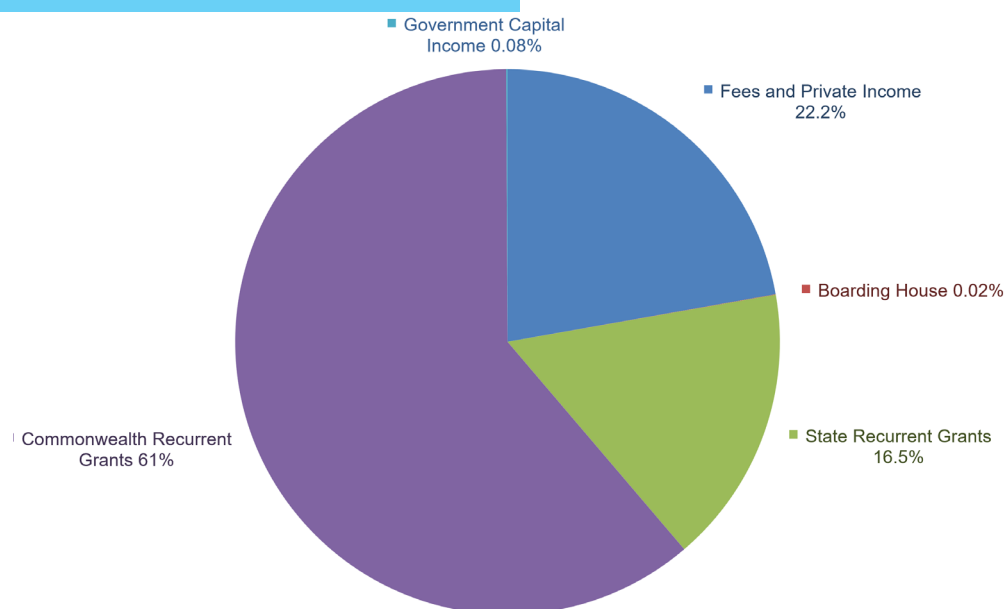

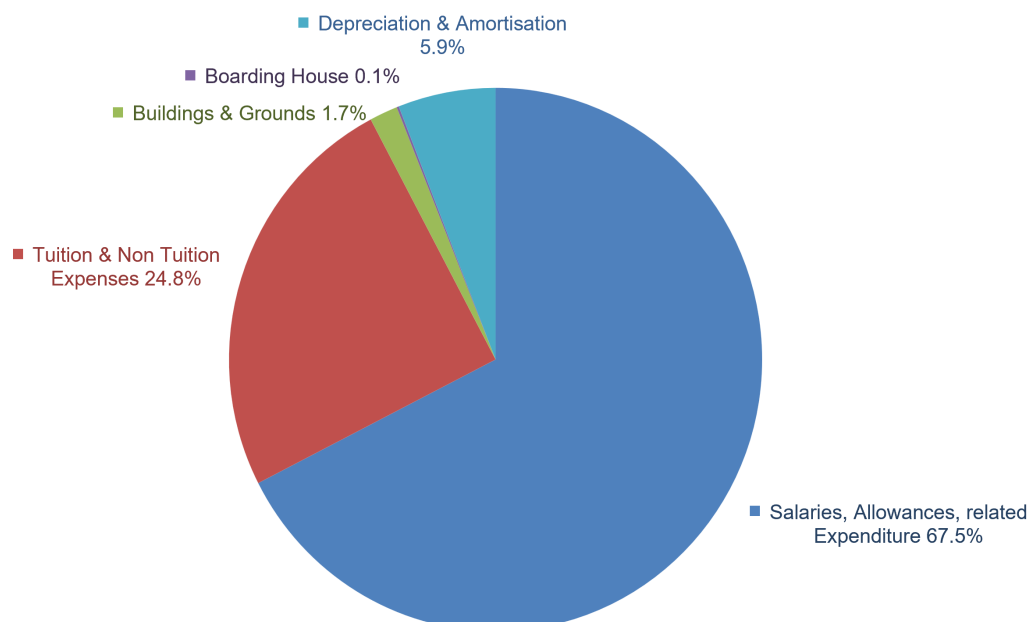
